School Captains, Isabell and Flynn, and members of the ELT (Educational Leadership Team) had the immense pleasure of having morning tea with two descendants of Mr Alexander McColl this week. Mr McColl was the first principal of ERSS. He opened the school on Monday, 5 February 1934, with an enrolment of 23 children. The McColl family have gifted the school community a precious and significant piece of memorabilia — an autograph book, with student signatures which was given to Mr McColl upon his departure for a lengthy overseas trip in 1939. Mr McColl retired on 30 June 1947. The family will return to ERSS to formally present the historical gift to our school community on a whole school parade in October. The significance of Mr McColl's contribution to our community is acknowledged by having a sports house being named in his honour.



Congratulations is extended to the children who nominated handwriting samples and artwork for judging at the show. Well done kids!

















Our inspirational Year 3 students are deeply passionate about this issue and it is wonderful that the children see that *by using their words, they can make a difference.*
















Mayor Greg Williamson Visit to Year 3

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


Whitsunday Voices Youth Literature Festival - Excursion

Pat, Koolaz and Billy are all surfers and perform together in the Proud Foots Band. Pat plays guitar and didgeridoo and sings lead vocals; never seen without her phone or surfboard, Koolaz plays funky bass; and Billy Blue Tongue is a chill, joke-telling lizard who loves banging the drum with his big, fat tail.
