Learning Area Content

English

When writing, students will create a portfolio of work including written diarry entry recounts or video diaries. During the writing process, students will

demonstrate their understanding of grammar, narrative text structure, language features, sentence types, specific vocabulary, spelling, punctuation and editing skills. Digital devices will be used to publish their final presentation piece. When reading, students will analyse and explain literal and implied information from a variety of texts. Students will explain and understand a variety of comprehension strategies for their reading assessment.

Mathematics

Students will work to further enhance their knowledge and understanding in the following mathematical areas:

Measurement & Geometry: Choose appropriate units of measurement for length, area, volume, capacity and mass. Calculate the perimeter and area of rectangles using familiar metric units.

Number and: Round and estimate to check an answer is reasonable. Use divisibility rules to divide, solve problems involving computation and apply computation to money problems.

Chance and probability: Make connections between events.

Time: Investigate and read analogue clocks, converting between 12 and 24 hour time.

HASS

Students will describe the significance of people and events in bringing about change. They will identify the causes and effects of the Gold rush on particular communities. Students will describe the experiences of different people in the past and examine sources to determine their purpose. They will investigate the effects that colonisation had on the lives of Aboriginal peoples and on the environment.

Science

Students will identify sources of light and model the transfer of light to explain observed phenomena. They will describe advances in science, pose questions, make predictions and plan investigation methods into the observable properties and behaviours of solids, liquids and gases.

The Arts

Students explore cultures use of art forms and describe how the arts communicate ideas, perspectives and/or meaning across cultures, times, places and/or other contexts. They describe how the arts are used to continue and revitalise cultures.

PE

Students will be involved in T-ball and Volleyball this term with Ms Green where they will develop the fundamental movement skills of running, jumping and throwing.

Health

Students will participate in Life ed and investigate their use of tech and the positives and negatives of being online, including unwanted contact and unsafe situations. They will identify practices that resolve in positive relationships and will be introduced to puberty.

LOTE
