LEARNING AREA CONTENT

English

Students will read, view, comprehend and create an informative text.

Assessment outline: Students will read and comprehend an informative text, identifying language features and purpose. Students will create a short, written informative text about a topic using words and images.

Reading

Our reading focus is on the explicit teaching of phonics across P-6. Phonics students will be learning-Week 3- 6 - f/c/b/g/l/u Week 7-10 - k/ck/v/y/z

Writing

Explicit teaching of letter formation, spelling, grammar, genre structure.

Maths

Number

Students will represent numbers 11-20 and subitise to 5. Students will partition and combine collections up to 10. Students will represent practical situations involving quantifying, adding to and taking away from collections to at least 10. **Assessment Outline:** Students will partition and combine collections up to 10 in different ways. To represent practical situations involving quantifying, adding to and taking

away from collections to at least 10.

Measurement

Students will learn to sequence the days of the week and times of the day and connect them to familiar events and actions.

Physical Education and Health

Students will explore how their bodies are growing and developing, and identify the actions that will keep them healthy, such as diet, hygiene and physical activity.
