Utilise expert teaching teams to enhance teaching capability

- Using literacy data to inform students' learning access points and improvement foci/learning goals
- Engage all teachers and teacher aides in professional development in the critical aspects of Oral Language, Phonics,
 Phonemic Awareness, Reading and Comprehension and Writing to implement quality differentiated, focused and intensive teaching
- Fund a co-teaching team to plan and teach with classroom teachers two hours per week with a focus on deepening teachers' pedagogical knowledge around reading and writing and allowing for focused differentiated teaching in the classroom
- Fund SLP (Speech Language Pathologists) services two days per week to build staff capability and support the implementation of an Oral Language program in the Early Years
- Target teacher aide support in the Early years by upskilling teacher aides to implement small group multi-Lit lessons to build solid literacy foundations
